### SESSION 1: THE ROLE OF RESEARCH IN SOCIAL INNOVATIONS

Digital health has the potential for transforming access to effective and affordable health services, but it also could reinforce existing inequalities. The focus of this session will be on the role of research in supporting innovation and in formulating and implementing strategies for taking the innovation to scale. Panelists will reflect on the challenges that need to be addressed and innovative approaches that have already emerged. The panel will explore the strengths and weaknesses of current approaches to research by health systems researchers and business schools and identify the kinds of research that would be most useful to governments and other stakeholders in the health innovation ecosystem. It will also explore how research can help governments and other stakeholders prepare for the new challenges likely to arise as traditional health systems are disrupted.
